13 new international Erasmus+ students have come to the Faculty for the Spring Program

The new Erasmus+ students have arrived at the Faculty of Humanities and Education for the spring semester of the 2016-2017 academic year. A total of 13 students have come for the second semester: 11 will be in the Education program and the other two in the Communications program. These students join the group of international students already in the Faculty: two Education students who are in the Erasmus+ program for the full academic year, and five North American students who have come from Texas to do their internships. Thus, there are presently 20 young people from other countries studying in the Faculty of Humanities and Education.

All of these new students, who are from Belgium, Lithuania, Norway, Poland and the Netherlands, have come to study in the two international programs offered by the Faculty of Humanities and Education: <u>Teacher</u> <u>Education</u>. International program (Spring) and the <u>Media and</u> <u>Comunications International programme</u>.
